

Twelfth Night - January 6th

Epiphany takes place on the last of the 12 days of Christmas (12th night) when we celebrate the coming of the wise men from the East to worship the new-born baby Jesus, and offer him gifts. In many countries in the world, example Spain, Italy and South America, it is a public holiday on the feast of epiphany when gifts are given with much celebrating, whereas in our country, it is traditionally the day for taking down our festive decorations.

Robert Herrick wrote in 1648, 'Partly work and partly play ye must on St. Distaff's Day'. This day is the day after Twelfth night-January 7th. In those days long ago, half the day might be spent at work and the rest of the day would be spent resting and recovering (after the excesses of Christmas & New Year!) This reminds us that life is made up of both work and play-both are important, as we would not appreciate either one of them so much without the other. It is the healthy mix of both that we can strive for!
